September bulb list 2021

Our pared-back edit mixes stone-cold classics with some rarer finds. All these bulbs are happy in part shade, will work in the ground, under deciduous trees (apart from the alliums) or in pots and window-boxes. They look best in clumps or bursting out of a pot. And you can never have too many – more is always more here.

You can layer two or three different bulbs in one pot that flower at different times for a long-lasting display and a lot of happiness or throw them into your borders and plant them where they land.

They are all perennials, coming back each year, often increasing in number. Ideally plant by end of October for flowering next Spring. We provide instructions with all bulbs.

Fritillaria uva-lupis / Fox grape fritillary

A pot of these unusual, very lovely fritillaries on a garden table or sill is a special thing. One of my favourite bulbs of the past few years.

Flowers March - April
20 - 30cm↑

Anemone blanda 'White Splendour' / winter windflower

Hard to beat. Long-flowering, easy to grow, perfect in pots, under trees, scattered through a window box. Like a child's drawing of a flower.

Galanthus nivalis / common snowdrop:

Absolutely, categorically, no garden should be without snowdrops. There are many, many cultivars but I don't think any are better than the original.

Flowers from January - March

Allium sicutum / Sicilian honey garlic:

One of the few alliums happy in part-shade. I love the unusual colouring, chandelier shape and structural seed heads, plus the bees love them.

Flowers from May - June
70 - 90cm↑

Narcissus 'Reggae':

Not everyone is on board with a peachy-pink daff but personally, I'm ready to captain that ship. I've been planting these for a few years and I always get asked what they are.

Muscari 'Pink Sunrise' / Pink grape hyacinth:

Unusual, hard-to-get hold of, covetable and not cheap, but imagine these pink fellas nestling amongst your ferns and peeping out of your window box.

Flowers March - May

Narcissus poeticus recurvus / Pheasant's eye narcissus:

Oh my goodness, so much narcissus choice out there but if you only have room for one, this highly-scented, late-flowering one is a total winner.

Hyacinthoides non-scripta / English bluebell:

Inky blue arching flowers on delicate stems. These take a little while to establish but worth the wait.
